But, last year just as the Oklahoma State was about to start everything changed in our world with the beginning of the China-Virus Lockdowns, which are still going on in some places. But, the Oklahoma State went on and was a success, as did 18 of our 26 scheduled CFDA Titled Championships in 2020. So, I hereby proclaim that due to the strong commitment of our CFDA Affiliated Host Clubs and members that our 2020 Season was a huge success!

I firmly believe that as the year goes on and the virus diminishes our 2021 Season may become the busiest and most successful season we have ever had. We will also have 2022 to look forward to, think of it, the 20th Anniversary of CFDA! Shouldn't we be planning some special things for next year? I think so!

Looking Back at 53 Years of Shooting Sports

This is my 53rd year in competitive shooting sports... I began at age 15, the year was 1968 when my Dad took me to a weekly contest with the Chicago Colts Fast Draw Club. I have been in love with shooting sports ever since. I not only loved them as a competitor, but also beginning in my 20's as an administrator, promoter and match director.

As a competitor, I've had the honor to rise to the top levels in several different shooting disciplines, Fast Draw, IPSC, Steel Challenge, Bowling Pin Shooting, Cowboy Action Shooting, and Cowboy Fast Draw.

As an Administrator, I have held every elected office in the World Fast Draw Association. As President of the Sierra Nevada Pistol League (IPSC), built the club to over 100 members. Founded the High Plains Drifters SASS Club, and as President built it to over 100 members. Authored the SASS RO Program, and was appointed Chairman of the SASS RO Committee for 9 years. Currently, Executive Director of CFDA.

As a Promoter, I doubt there is anyone in the history of all shooting sports who has promoted or has been Match Director of more major shooting championships. I have done this in most of the disciplines I have competed in. But of course, I must acknowledge all of the great people over the years who helped make all of that possible, because no one can undertake such

monumental tasks alone. I'm proud and fortunate to have made hundreds of life-long friends along the way.

Without question, I have dedicated a huge part of my life to shooting sports, I am a strong believer in giving back to those who have given me so much enjoyment. I am also extremely fortunate to have a great family that not only puts up with me in these endeavors, they support me in more ways than anyone could ever imagine.

Integrity of Shooting Sports

The reason why I wrote the above section, was so that you may understand my prospective from what I am about to write.

I have noticed a trend in almost every shooting discipline. At first, they are founded upon a firm set of principles that sets them apart and makes them unique. Then, within a few years they begin to relax their founding principles. Apparently, they do this in hopes of attracting new members or possibly they are trying to make it easier for children to get involved. Sometimes, it does result in gaining some members, but usually it does not sustain itself for long, and they begin to decline in popularity.

You can really call Fast Draw the granddaddy of all Action Shooting Sports. It began in 1955, when a fellow by the name of Dee Woolem invented a Fast Draw Timer and held the 1st National Championship at Knott's Berry Farm, where he worked as a reenactor robbing a train. Dee Woolem, who I had the pleasure to meet and interview in 1995, has long been considered the Father of Fast Draw.

Fast Draw originally was just that, FAST DRAW. What I mean by that, is that there were no targets, no reactions, and no wax bullets. You placed your trigger finger on a button, with your hand at least 6" from your gun, your six-gun was loaded shells containing only primers. When the judges announced they were ready, you could begin your draw. They used a large clock-faced timer, where one sweep of the hand around the clock was one-second. When your hand went for the gun, your trigger finger also released the start button. When you fired your gun, the speaker would react to the sound, enact the clutch, stopping the hand of the timer, which indicated your time to the hundredth of a second. Only the actual raw-time of the draw was recorded.

Within just a few years, in an effort to add more substance to the sport, they added an event called Walk & Draw Level. Shooters would face each other at a distance of about 60 feet and on the command of an announcer they would begin walking towards each other, with safety blanks in their six-guns. They still imposed the 6" Hand Rule, and as you can imagine there were a lot of missed draws and dropped guns. It was exciting to watch, and soon tournaments were held in Tombstone and other locations, with the Sahara-Colt Nationals being held in Las Vegas for 4 years, from 1959 through 1962. Clint Eastwood actually

paid an entry and competed.

Soon shooters started adding more "substance" like wax bullet events and started to use balloons to prove they could actually hit a target. But, during this time the sport also took a liberal turn towards equipment modifications, including the development of fanning hammers, bucket-booted holsters, extremely modified and ultra-lightened six-guns. By 1960 it was all about speed and many had dreams of becoming famous as The Fastest Gun Alive.

The Sport of Fast Draw has been at odds with itself for over 65 years, with a constant argument over Speed vs Accuracy. The sport allowed the modification of its equipment to the point that not only did it no longer have any reasonable ties to the Old West, but went well beyond anything to do with Hollywood.

Please don't get me wrong, any form of Fast Draw requires an incredible amount of devotion and development of skill to be successful at. I admire all of them, and I was there too, practicing to eliminate every thousandths of a second and doing whatever it took to win, like everyone else, and I loved it!

I am also not running down the World Fast Draw Association (WFDA), as I dedicated a huge amount of time and energy in the 6 years I spent during the 90's trying to bring it back from near extinction as its Secretary and then Chairman. I will always love it and remember the great times and most of all the life-long friends I made because of it. However, I moved on from it, because of constant arguments and politics, then went on to spend almost a decade enjoying Cowboy Action Shooting (SASS). Unfortunately, I doubt the WFDA currently has more than 50 active members in North America, and that truly saddens me.

What CFDA Stands For

I became interested in Fast Draw again when the Founder of CFDA, Brad Hemmah, called me for advice on a number of subjects during its formation, especially about equipment. Brad and I both know each other well from our WFDA days, as he was the Host of the Deadwood World Championships from 1992 to 2000, we worked together closely. He got fed up with the WFDA for the same reasons I did, and we shared a mutual vision of the proper balance between Speed vs Accuracy. That is the concept of how the target sizes and distances were determined for Cowboy Fast Draw. Brad also wanted to instill a sense of the Old West in CFDA, as in his words within the second paragraph of his Founder's Letter that we will always publish in every edition of the CFDA Rule Book.

As a result, our current team has built our membership numbers from just under 300 to almost 6,500! We are the largest Fast Draw organization to ever exist, by far, and there is a reason for that, we stand by our Founding Principles. However, I can tell you that we have

not reached even a tenth of our potential, which is what I hope to put in place with the help of a lot of great people!

WFPG & XFDA

I have refrained from public comments on these apparent off-shoots of CFDA. The leader of WFPG on social media in particular has tried to pull me into some sort of online public argument, for which I have no interest.

However, the time has come to state to our membership where I stand.

WFPG - I consider some of them as disgruntled CFDA members who did not want to compete against our general membership who value the proper balance of speed vs accuracy. They also disagreed with steps that CFDA took to protect the "Integrity of Our Game". That is their right and America is a free country. If they wish to shoot at Blocker Targets at closer distances, that priority speed over accuracy that is also their right, and I hold no ill will against them, or anyone else that wishes to play their game. However, because of what I have written in this article, it is also my right not to take the time to involve myself with something that I don't agree with. I truly hope they come back to CFDA again someday, but that, of course, is their choice.

XFDA - While they are very friendly and maintain good terms with CFDA, most of them are still very involved and active with CFDA, which I truly value and appreciate. They also shoot Blocker Targets at closer distances. Which as previously stated, is simply a concept that I cannot support. I wish them the best and look forward to seeing all of them as the CFDA begins over the coming months.

Liability Insurance

There is another misconception that I've attacked clubs that use Blocker Targets and practice for or hold WFPG or XFDA events, by cancelling their CFDA Liability Insurance. The fact is, that since 2006, we have always required that clubs offer CFDA exclusively if they want to participate in the NRA/CFDA Liability Insurance Program. We simply cannot understand why anyone should believe that CFDA should expose ourselves to the liability of other shooting disciplines. As a longtime businessman and Executive Director of CFDA, It would be negligent and incompetent on my part to allow that. The CFDA insurance program is in most cases less expensive, just a few hundred dollars, than a club acquiring their own Shooting Club Insurance Policy and naming CFDA as an "Additionally Insured". Organizations like SASS requires that of all clubs provide their own insurance and name SASS as Additionally Insured.

In Closing

I just wish everyone the best. We should all be excited about the 2021 Season ahead and be thankful for the common passion that we all share. Hope to see you all on the line at a CFDA Event!

Shootout in the Swamp were:


Shooter's World, Halifax Health, Intracoastal Bank, All of the Florida Fast Draw Clubs.



Saturday evening folks gathered inside the indoor range for a great tri-tip meal prepared by a local butcher-deli shop The Wagon Wheel. The Pot Shoot Awards were handed out and The Early Entry Gun drawing was hand-picked by Shell Shock.

Diablo Daisy was the lucky winner!! Again, The Gold Country Out Riders spilled out the poker chips and let them fall as they may, with the winnings donated to Shoot For The Stars.

Sunday morning came early as the Magnificent 7 were determined with the final shoot offs. Shortly after, we set off into the Brackets. (See results on next page)

Then back to the California State Finals..... We kicked it off with the only two Jr. Girls, Prickly Pear out from Arizona and Shell Shock up from Texas. Prickly Pear had won the first battle against Shell Shock with three out of five shots. They switched lanes and gave it another try. Prickly Pear got the first hit, then Shell Shock, but it was Prickly Pear that prevailed. Shell Shock placed 2nd and Prickly Pear became our California State Jr. Girls Champion!!

Then off to the Jr. Boys....we had Sheriff Rango over from Nevada and Tank down from Idaho. It was Tank that got the first hit on the target but soon later Sheriff Rango put three in a row to take the first round between these young gentlemen. They switched lanes and gave it another go. The score was two to one in Sheriff Rango's favor. Both young men hit, but Sheriff Rango

beat out Tanks .348 with a .342. So very close. Tank took 2nd place and Sheriff Rango became our California State Jr. Boys Champion!!

Excitement happened on the line during the ladies finals. The Magnificent 7 started with Miss B Haven, 7th seed and Sweet Fuse, 6th seed. The score became two to one in Miss B Havens favor. Both ladies hit their next shot but it was Miss B Haven's .454 that was faster than Sweet Fuse's .474 which moved her up to take on KK Kid, 5th seed. Miss B Haven gets the first shot on the plate with a .418 but KK Kid strikes back with a Record Breaking .318!!! Needing to keep this Record Time, KK Kid would have to bring a .323 or faster. As both ladies were giving their best, they both hit but KK Kid brought more heat with yet, another Ladies Record Time of .316 to Miss B Havens .449!!! As the bout continues two to two, KK Kid moves on to take on Legally Loaded, moving Miss B Haven back down to shoot it out with Sweet Fuse. That bout was finished up placing Sweet Fuse in 7th place. As KK Kid and Legally Loaded continue two to two, Legally Loaded takes that round putting KK Kid down to shoot in lanes three and



four with Miss B Haven again, as Legally Loaded takes on 3rd seed Blondie. KK Kid takes the round from Miss B Haven sending her home in 6th place. After taking the bout two to two, Blondie sends Legally Loaded down to shoot for placement with KK Kid in lanes three and four. This brings out 2nd seed Nessa Rose to tend to Blondie. As KK Kid and Legally Loaded go two to two, Legally Loaded sends KK Kid home in 5th place. Blondie and Nessa Rose take their bout one to two, Nessa Rose puts the final hit on her

target sending Blondie down to

in lanes three and four. This

brings out our top seed, Huckleberry Honey. As the round goes two to two between Legally Loaded and Blondie in lanes three and four, Legally Loaded puts the final hit on her target sending Blondie home in 4th place. On lanes one and two Huckleberry Honey wins the bout with three out of five hits putting her in the cat bird seat, waiting and watching to see who she takes on for 1st and 2nd place. Meanwhile, this will put Nessa Rose and Legally Loaded at center stage to battle for 3rd place. Nessa Rose swiftly puts three hits on her target sending Legally Loaded home in 3rd place. Huckleberry Honey comes back out and takes Nessa Rose off lane three and moves her to lane four. Being a two X elimination during the final, if Nessa Rose wins they'll be even with one X each. If Huckleberry Honey wins, she'll take the win and it'll be

all over. Nessa Rose gets the first two hits

on her target with a two to zero score, but Huckleberry Honey comes back to make it even with a two to two score. Both ladies slap a hit on their targets, but Huckleberry Honey takes the win with her .454 beating out Nessa Rose's .580. The Ladies Finals finish off with Nessa Rose taking 2nd place and Huckleberry Honey as our Ladies 2020 California State Champion.

After we caught our breath, we get down to the Men's Magnificent 7. Our 6th seed Dead Eye Kid takes lane one giving Taz, our 7th seed, lane two. After Dead Eye Kid puts on three faster shots in a row he puts Taz down into lanes three and four for placement.

This brings up our 5th seed, Buzzard Cooper who takes lane one, putting Dead Eye Kid on lane two. After five shots, Dead Eye Kid sends Buzzard Cooper down to lanes three and four to join Taz. Up next we send out our 4th seed, Crosswired. He and his big black hat take lane two bouncing Dead Eye Kid to lane one. Buzzard Cooper takes out Taz after four shots putting Taz in 7th place, while Dead Eye Kid takes out Crosswired sending him over to tend with Buzzard Cooper. This brings out our 3rd seed, Run Fat Man Run to shoot it out with Dead Eye Kid. After taking it two to two, between Crosswired and Buzzard Cooper, Crosswired put the final hit on the target to send Buzzard Cooper out in 6th place. Meanwhile on lane one, Dead Eye Kid slaps on five hits in a row but Run Fat Man Run has three faster hits of his own, sending Dead Eye Kid over to contend with Crosswired. Then out walks our 2nd seed Tank, who takes lane two. After squaring off between Crosswired and Dead Eye Kid on lanes three and four, Crosswired seals the deal and sends Dead Eye Kid home in 5th place. Not counting their tying shot of .347, Tank puts three more hits on the target to call the win his and sends Run Fat Man Run over to shoot it out with Crosswired for placement. Then out comes our 1st seed, Vic Torious. Crosswired and Run Fat Man Run keep things even on lanes three and four with a score of two to two but Run Fat Man Run takes the final shot to win and sends Crosswired home, placing 4th. Now to determine 3rd place we have Run Fat Man Run and Tank on lanes three and four, while Vic Torious is sitting in the cat bird seat. Run Fat Man Run was the first to put a hit on the target but it would be Tank who took the round for the win putting Run Fat Man Run in 3rd place. Now it came down to the last two contenders. 2020 Lady's CFDA Top Gun of the Year Interview By: Quick Cal

Quick Cal (QC)

Howdy Dead Eye Daisy, it's a pleasure to speak with you this evening. Your family, The Dalton Gang, came into our sport at the beginning of 2019 and made a huge impact not only as competitors, but as great representatives of sportsmanship. It's a CFDA Tradition to interview our Top Guns of the Year and publish an article in our Spring Gunslinger's Gazette.

Dead Eye Daisy (DED)

Quick Cal, it's great to hear from you. I can't begin to tell you how much JC Dalton, Flying Cowgirl and I have loved getting involved with Cowboy Fast Draw and getting to know so many wonderful people.

OC: Well, I have some questions to ask, let's get started.....

How do you feel about winning CFDA Top Gun of the 2020 Year?

DED: It's a Huge Honor! There are so many great competitors to shoot against, it's just huge to win Top Gun of the Year! Plus, we're having so much fun in this game, we just love to participate with so many good people.

OC: How did you get started in Cowboy Fast Draw?

DED: (John) JC Dalton has always loved firearms and shooting sports and was watching Shooting USA in January of 2019 when they

were covering the 2018 FGA and he thought it would be fun to get involved. He called the CFDA office and talked to you on the phone for a long time about how to get started.....

QC: I remember that call, and yes, he had so many questions, we spent over an hour on the

DED: Yes, he was so excited and ordered what he needed to get started, a gun, holster, timer/ target, and wax ammo. So, he set it up in the basement and started to practice and just loved it! Then, he asked (Kael) Flying Cowgirl and me to join him and give it a try. Kael and I really had a lot of fun and loved sharing it with him. Also, as you know, John had a stroke a few years ago. We thought this would be not only great therapy for him, but it was something we could all do together as a family! John then called you again and ordered what we needed for two lanes, including lasers and laser targets and everything else we needed for Kael and me. As soon as we got it, we set it up in the garage and have been practicing and shooting ever since.

OC: What was your first contest?

DED: It was I believe in April of 2019, we called the Black River Bandits in Wisconsin, and talked to Fossilman and Lightn'in and let them know we were coming, which was an 8 hour drive. They thought it was a little strange that Flying Cowgirl, a 12 year old girl who had just started, already had a Level 4 Card issued by

QC: Yes, that was unusual for sure. But, when JC Dalton sent me videos showing the progress she had made and when I received her letter where she wrote about studying to be a pilot, being an experienced hunter and trap shooting competitor, I just knew there was something special about this "young lady". So, I felt the Level 4 Card was appropriate, since our Youth Program is designed to allow our young shooters develop at their own

DED: When we showed up Fossilman, Light'nin and the rest of their club were so helpful and supportive, they really helped us get totally involved. Also, once they met and shot with Flying Cowgirl, they agreed with your decision. OC: What do you love most about Cowboy Fast Draw?

DED: The people! Plus, I have always loved to compete in sports like Basketball, Volley Ball, and I love to ski. Cowboy Fast Draw gives me a chance to practice, improve and enjoy competition again.

OC: What inspired you to train to become a

DED: I thought, if we're going to travel to

matches as a family, I wanted to practice enough to be capable of winning. I discovered that I really enjoy practicing, measuring my progress and seeing that progress show up as better results at matches.

OC: How much do you practice?

DED: I practice 5 or 6 days a week. I shoot 4 or 5 rounds at 15', and sometimes move closer to work on speed. I always keep my session under 30 shots. I also practice, just a few minutes at a time, on the laser target we also keep set up inside our home.

OC: Do you have any tips for our members?

DED: PRACTICE! To be consistent and keep improving you have got to practice! Cowboy Fast Draw keeps growing and the shooters keep improving, so you also have got to keep improving. Also, Just Have Fun!



2020 Men's CFDA Top Gun of the Year Interview By: Quick Cal

Quick Cal (QC)1

Howdy Rodeo Romeo, glad I got a hold of you this weekend, I heard you were working in Las Vegas at a big auction as the Auctioneer. Congratulations! On your National Championship this year and the remarkable year you had in winning the Top Gun of the Year. It's a CFDA Tradition to interview our Top Guns of the Year and publish an article in our Spring Gunslinger's Gazette. Rodeo Romeo (RR)

Quick Cal, Thank You and yes I'm in Las Vegas for about 2 months now and I'm sure looking to getting back home to Phoenix and begin practicing again for the upcoming season.

<u>QC</u>: I have some questions to ask, let's get started.....

How do you feel about winning CFDA Top Gun of the 2020 Year?

RR: Pretty Awesome! Winning Top Gun has always been one of my main goals. But, with my line of work it is hard to travel to make as many events as I would like to. So, with the shortened season due to Covid-19 and lowering the minimum to 5 matches to count for points instead of the normal 6 this year, helped me qualify.

<u>QC:</u> How did you get started in Cowboy Fast Draw?

RR: My Brother Dry Gulcher and his wife Yowee went to a Try Cowboy Fast Draw event in Glendale, AZ back in 2011 and really enjoyed it. They told me about it and we all went together to an Association of Arizona Gunslingers contest at the Pioneer Museum and really got hooked on the sport. I have made life-long friends from all over the U.S. that I never would have had without it.

QC: What do you love most about Cowboy Fast Draw?

<u>RR.</u>: The people! The camaraderie in our sport is amazing! They will lend you equipment, give you pointers, and just generally help you. Plus, the Cowboy Way is a big thing with me, since I was raised on a ranch and lived as a cowboy.

QC: What inspired you to train to become a champion?

RR: As a cowboy growing up, I really got into Rodeo, and competed a lot as a Team Roper. So, I have always wanted to train to be the best that I could be at anything I do. I also competed in 2004 and became the National Auctioneer Champion. When

I started in CFDA, I gave myself three years to learn the game and hoped to be good enough to win. In 2014, that came true at the Southern Territorial in Odessa, TX and then I repeated in 2015. I went through a period that I thought I was good enough and didn't need to practice much anymore. It didn't take long to realize how good I really was, I quit winning. Once I resumed training, I started winning again. I also found out that I enjoyed helping others train, so I set up the Fast Draw Camp to help others learn how to train.

OC: How much do you practice?

RR: I normally train at least two times during the week and then shoot local matches or train on weekends. Three times a week works pretty good for me. However, when I'm prepping for a major event I shoot almost every day. Except, that in the final days leading up to a major shoot, I lay off practicing and just focus on enjoying myself at the event. I also limit the number of shots in practice sessions, I don't want to over-practice and turn it into a job.

<u>OC:</u> Do you have any tips for our members? RR: You get out of the sport what you

put into it. A lot of members get into the sport mainly to socialize and make friends. That's Cool! CFDA has something for everyone to enjoy at any level of competition. You can enjoy our sport anyway you want. Whether you train to be a champion or not, always make sure that you're having fun.

QC: What accomplishment are you most proud of?

RR: I'm really proud of winning the Triple Crown they held in Amarillo this past year. Winning the Southern Territorial again and my first National Championship on the same week was really amazing. That weekend is what really made winning Top Gun of the Year possible for me.

OC: What are your Goals for 2021?

RR: Stay consistent repeat Top Gun of the Year and get another shot at the ultimate goal of winning the Fastest Gun Alive! I just want to continue to love Cowboy Fast Draw, and our CFDA Family. CFDA has so many great programs like the Safety & Range Officer Training Courses, and I especially like the CFDA Shoot for the Stars Scholarship Foundation. Just allaround a great sport to be involved with.

QC: Thanks Rodeo Romeo and we really appreciate your auctioneering abilities at our annual Shoot for the Stars Auction at FGA! Good Luck in 2021!







rirst a little background, nine years ago my wife Ricochet Rose and I started our CFDA club the Gold Country Out Riders. The name came from our proximity to Sutter's Mill and the nearby California gold discovery in 1848. The Out Riders part came from the John Wayne movie "The War Wagon". The Out Riders were the hired guns, tasked with protecting the War Wagon and its gold shipment. Now the story of Warren "Bad Eye" Burns. Warren contacted me after seeing an article in the local newspaper about our new Fast Draw club. He was in his late seventy's by then and not in the best of health, but he wanted to give it a try. He absolutely loved it. He would call and ask to bring friends and family members over. A few months in and Warren wanted to go with me to the Reno Peacemakers monthly shoot. We had a great time and got a chance to get to know each other better. But it is what happened on our way home that made "Bad Eye Burns" unforgettable. I stopped for fuel at the state line and while I was fueling my truck Warren says, "Oh dang I lost my eye". His glass eye had popped out and I found it on the floor behind the passenger seat. I picked it up and gave it back to him. We had a good laugh. But that was not the end of the story. We had made it about another 40 miles when he said, "Dang it I

lost my eye again." I told him "you're not using it anyway, and it can't get out of my truck between here and my place." I asked him how many glass eyes he had had over the course of 50 plus years since he had lost his eye. He told me this was the only one. I told him "Heck you lost it twice in my truck." When we got back to my place, I parked on the lower driveway so Warren could unload his gear, and I went searching for his lost eye. I found it between the center console and the passenger seat's mounting rail. Funny thing it had landed staring up at me. My hands were too big to fetch it out, but luckily my wife was coming down the stairs about that time. By this time Warren and I were laughing so hard she thought we were pranking her. I assured her we were not but really needed her help. I showed her where his eye was staring up at her and she reluctantly reached in and fetched it out and handed it to Warren. I have told this story many times and it never fails to get a chuckle. Unfortunately, we lost Warren not too long after that. He would have been a great ambassador for our sport. I was reminded of this story a few months ago when I received an email from his daughter. She and her husband wanted to come try cowboy fast draw as away to honor her Dad. I learned from her that apparently, Warren liked to tell this story of his lost eye as well. So many come and go in our sport, I wanted to share this story in memory of Bad Eye Burns.





A Ghost Story

By John West as told to him by Gentleman George

"Mr. Murry, sur, ah needs sum hep."

Mr. Murry looked up from his checker game and saw an old farmer. He was wearing a pair of worn coveralls and a greasy John Deere baseball style hat. The sleeves of his long underwear poked out from under his coveralls.

It was 1932, in the town of Cheneyville, Louisiana. Several men were playing checkers in the town square. Permanent, stone checker board tables, set in a row, on a cement slab, were popular with the men in town.

"Wat can ah do fo ya?" asked Mr. Murry. "Ah lost ma mule. I cain't find'em. I got ten acres I gotta plow taday. I heard ya could find'em."

Known as a physic or fortune teller, many people came from throughout Louisiana to Cheneyville, asking Mr. Murry for help.

A tall, thin black man, Robert Murry farmed a small patch of ground owned by the city sheriff. Murry had a gift of sight. Even as a boy, he just naturally found things. He also seemed to know what lay ahead for people in town. He could predict the weather. He knew when it would be hot or cold,

Farmers, in the area, relied on his advice. He knew what to plant and when. He actually had a decent income from grateful folks in town. The sheriff used him from time to time to help solve a crime or to find a missing person or animal.

The thing Robert liked most was to play checkers. The permanent stone tables with checker board tops were built by the city because Murry did his best forecasting after playing checkers.

Rarely did Murry lose a game of checkers. Players from other towns came to Chenevville just to play checkers with Mr. Murry. The county fair always had a checker tournament, usually won by Mr. Murry.

When Mr. Murry died, the city erected a three person crypt, just for him. Six graves sites, along one side of the crypt, were saved for his pall bearers. Set up, at a slight angle, a stone checker table sat in front of the crypt. A chair sat anchored, at the end of the table, away from the door.

Legend has it, that Mr. Murry will join you in a game of checkers. You need only knock on the crypt door, and say, "Mr. Murry, how about a game of checkers," then walk around the table and sit in the chair. The door of the crypt would open slowly and Mr. Murry would come out and play. He even had his own set of checkers.

My friends and I were seniors in high school. We tended to get a bit wild at times. I had a pick up and my buddies would pile in the back, usually with a case of beer, and we would drive up and down some dirt, county road until the beer was gone. Sometimes we went to the county dump with our 22's and shot rats. Drinking beer and shooting rats was a good time. So good that often it was a toss-up between a night with the boys, or a date with Betty Jean.

One May night, we were bored with nothing to do. The beer was almost gone and we were feeling, 'hot to trot with no place to race.' George came up with the idea that we should go to the cemetery and ask Mr. Murry for a game of checkers. George often came up with hair-brained schemes.

One time George took the pole, from the track team shed, used for pole vaulting and challenged us to vault over Boeuf Bayou Creek. Just plant it in the middle of the creek he said, and ride it over to the other side. He even volunteered to show us how to do it. As it turned out, George was not fast enough to carry himself across the creek on the pole. He stalled out about half way over, tipped to one side,

Having enough beer this night, we all thought a checker game was a great idea. We drove to the Chenevville cemetery, parked the truck, and finished off the beer. A long, gravel road ran along the side of the cemetery. About a hundred yards down the road and a few feet to the left, marked Mr. Murry's crypt.

The night couldn't be any better for a walk in a cemetery. The full moon shone brightly, casting shadows everywhere. Big, old Oak trees grew in and out of the cemetery. Their limbs hung to the ground, covered in moss. A breeze whined through the leaves, moving the limbs back and forth, casting moving shadows over the ground. Chipmunks and ground squirrels scurried about the leaves on the ground, creating spooky sounds. A hoot owl made his presence known. A rodent of some kind, screamed as an owl lifted him off the ground.

Feelin' the beer, with false bravado, we made our way down the road and found the crypt. Since it was George's idea for a checker game, he was the one to knock on the door. George staggered up to the door, banged on it, and shouted out for Mr. Murry to come out for a checker game. He then made his way round the table and sat in the chair. The rest of us leaned on the tombstones and waited, real casual like.

A minute went by and, with a relieved tone, George suggested we go because Mr. Murry was not coming out. I said to give him another minute or two cause he had to get out of his casket first, and then walk to the door, plus he might be hard

It wasn't much longer when a creaking

sound got our attention. It could have been anywhere, but, for us, it seemed to be comin' from the door. The moon cast a bright light and we could see the door clearly. A shadow appeared where there was none before. It had the appearance of a door. The shadow moved slowly across the front of the crypt, as if the door was opening.

We will never know if Robert Murry stepped out to play checkers. We will never know what he looked like after forty years long dead. We were nowhere near that crypt, two seconds after the door creaked open. Shrieking and the sound of pounding feet filled the air. My baseball hat flew off my head as I ran. It took less than a second to decide it would stay where it lay. Mr. Murry could have it if he wanted it.

We were all sure we could out run a man who had been dead for forty years, but, then again, if he could step out of a coffin to play checkers, he might have the where-with-all to glide quickly across a cemetery.

I, myself, was surprised by how quickly I became sober. I had heard people could die of fright. I don't know if that is true, but, I do know, for me personally, a man can sprint, through a cemetery and clearly hurdle several tombstones in a single breath.

Diving into the bed of a truck could be painful, but, four teen-age boys easily cleared the tail gate without a second's hesitation. There might have been a spoiled pair of britches or two that night, but, no one cared. I revved the ole truck past the red line and popped the clutch. Rocks flew from the tires, and we left that cemetery far behind.

If anyone ever asked us about that night; we verified the legend of Mr. Murry and told them to check it out for themselves if they didn't believe us.

Although we didn't shake hands on it, or take a secret oath, none of us were ever going back to Mr. Murry's crypt again.

If you visit the cemetery, you can see the headstone for Robert Murry. It shows he was born in 1888. However, there is no date declaring his death, that date is blank. What do you think?
